ANC Coverage (4 visits) 70% 63%


Institutional deliveries 43% 48%

Under five Mortality Rate 168/1000 119/1000








Policies in place

- Child Health Policy (2006)
 - Preventive (PHC)
 - Curative
- Nutrition Policy
 - Policy on Infant and Young Child Feeding in place & Operational Strategy developed
 - Statutory Instrument on Marketing Breast- milk substitutes now under enforcement
- Reproductive Health Policy







How did we achieve results-1

- Analysis of Problem at hand
 - Human resource crisis
 - 40 years needed to produce number of doctors required
 - 20 years needed to produce number of nurses required
- Urgent and immediate feasible solution
 - Task Shifting
 - Take services as close as possible to the family
 - Community Health Worker Strategy- Shifting of tasks from health workers to CHWs (this meant upgrading of skills and knowledge)





Taking stock of the position


- National Countdown conference
 - All stakeholder participated
 - Took stock of achievements/ trends of coverage of various high impact interventions, inequities in health service delivery,
 - Took stock of bottlenecks impeding achievement of universal coverage of high impact interventions,
 - This process helped to reposition the priorities to focus on what need to be done for maximum impact to be realised





Gaining momentum-Policy change 1

- Development of the Community Health Worker Strategy process:
 - MOH constituted small technical team to draft policy framework
 - Multi sectoral collaboration
 - Engagement of Ministers of health, finance and education
 - Public Service management Division brought on board
 - Professional bodies as well as regulatory authorities engaged- Medical Council of Zambia, General Nursing Council, Zambia Medical Association, Pharmaceutical Regulatory Authority and other civil society organizations







Gaining momentum-Policy change2

- Development of the Community Health Worker Strategy process contd:
 - Government Approval process-Cabinet Memorandum prepared for Minister of Health to present in cabinet chaired by the President. Conveyance given.
 - Consensus building with all stakeholders on the implementation plan
- Community case management:
 - Home management for malaria is implemented in selected districts and now in the process of adding pneumonia and diarrhoea



Gaining momentum - Creating demand in Community

- MOH recognition of the vital role that communities can play in their own health
- Various interventions in place but coverage still needs to be increased
 - Immunisation, Community IMCI, Child Health Weeks, SMAGs, New born care
- Communication of appropriate messages
 - MNCH Communication strategy developed and finalised
 - Implementation of various BCC activities for communities and families





Gaining momentum Free Health care

 Government realising the negative impact of user fees on health service delivery abolished these fees in order to increase access to health services

 Costed Roadmap for Maternal, Child and Newborn to guide implementation of interventions at all levels
